- Network Operator's Group
- not limited *only* to network engineers
- open and independent community
- human network of people with common technical interests

What is CSNOG?

- an attempt to establish a NOG community in Czech Republic and Slovakia
- founded informally during RIPE 75, 22nd October 2017
- top-bottom rather than bottom-up
 - organized by CZ.NIC, NIX-CZ and CESNET
 - still this **is not** a conference by CZ.NIC or others
 - open for partners and organizers

ISO 639-1 language code, lower case, eg. cs, sk, en

ISO 3166-1 country code, upper case, eg. CZ, SK, GB

- first CSNOG held 11th to 12th June 2018 in Brno
- this is the second meeting

Programme committee

Programme committee

- independent body responsible for the meeting programme
- members seek attractive and relevant content
- members chair the meeting
- elected by visitors

Programme committee election idea

- 12 members
- after each meeting, one third is replaced

Programme committee bootstrapping

- eight members appointed by organizers
- no election made yet
 - what voting system to choose – STV, IRV, *FPP*
 - who should be eligible – everybody who attended m from last n meetings
 - how to actually proceed with elections
- no solution to corner cases
 - not enough volunteers
 - members resigning
